Writing to Donor Families



The decision to reach out to your donor family is deeply personal. For donor families, receiving communication from their loved one's recipient brings comfort and validates the meaningful impact their loved one made.

For recipients, writing provides an opportunity to say thank you for the gift of life they have been given. Some recipients struggle to express their gratitude, but there are no wrong words – the most meaningful sentiments stem from the heart.

There's no set timeframe for writing your letter; you can do so when you feel ready. However, keep in mind that reaching out years later may pose challenges in locating family members.

Identities are kept confidential to protect the privacy of both recipient and donor family until both parties agree to share identifying information.

Ideas to share about yourself:

- Your transplant experience and how it has affected your life
- · Why you are grateful for their loved one's gift
- · Your occupation, hobbies and interests
- · Your family information (marital status, children, grandchildren)
- Photographs of yourself and/or family members
- Use your first name only and avoid any identifying information, such as city, hospital/transplant center or physician names.

Will I hear from the donor family?

While many families appreciate hearing about the recipient's transplant experience, some find it difficult to express their emotions in writing. Therefore, there's no guarantee of a response, and the timing of any reply will vary. If the letter cannot be delivered for any reason, the organ procurement organization (OPO) will inform your transplant coordinator.

Mailing your correspondence:

Please keep a copy of your letter for your records. Your letter must be sent to your transplant coordinator and may take several weeks to reach the donor family. When submitting your letter, be sure to include the following:
